

Students' private work in mathematics classrooms in Sweden, Philippines and Japan: Are these didactical situations?

This seminar will focus on instructional and learning approaches during student private work in classrooms with competent mathematics teachers in Japan, Philippines and Sweden. The study on which the seminar reports analyzed mathematics instructions at this stage of the lessons and the interactions of students while they were working privately. It especially noted their mathematical reasoning skills. The research showed some of the priorities valued by the teachers and the students in these three locations.

Florenda Gallos Cronberg is a mathematics education lecturer and researcher at the University of Gothenburg in Sweden. She has previously worked at the University of the Philippines, and at Edith Cowan University in Western Australia. Her research interests are on the professional development of mathematics teachers, curriculum development studies and on students' learning.
