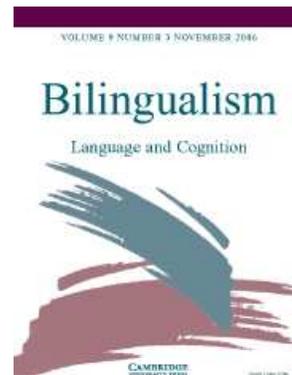


Lunchtime Talk

Submitting Articles to Peer-reviewed Journals: Views from an Editor

Abstract

In this informal talk, Professor Ping Li will share his experience as an editor in reading articles submitted to the journal *Bilingualism: Language and Cognition*. He will explain the submission process, discuss some of the common problems found in the articles submitted and provide some useful tips for writers.

Professor Ping Li received his graduate training at the Max Planck Institute for Psycholinguistics, Nijmegen, and received his Ph.D. in 1990. He subsequently did postdoctoral research with Elizabeth Bates at the University of California, San Diego. He took a faculty position in the Department of Psychology at the Chinese University of Hong Kong between 1992 and 1996. He later moved to the University of Richmond in the United States, where he currently is Professor of Psychology and Cognitive Science. Professor Li is also an editor of the well-known international peer-reviewed journal: *Bilingualism: Language and Cognition*. His latest publication includes: Li, P., Tan, L, Bates, E., & Tzeng, O.J.L. (2006). *Handbook of East Asian Psycholinguistics (Vol.1: Chinese)*. Cambridge, UK: Cambridge University Press.
