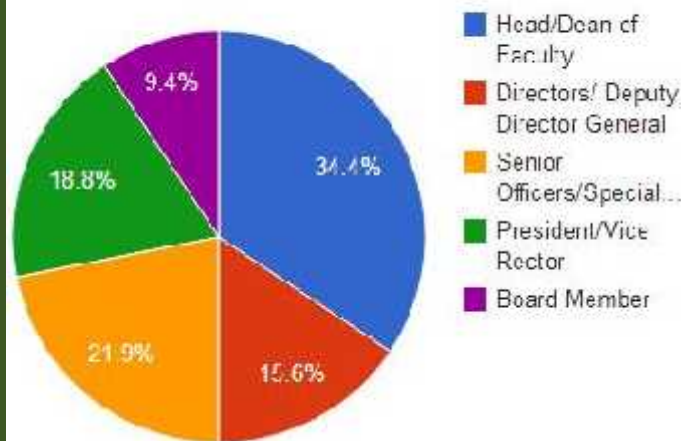

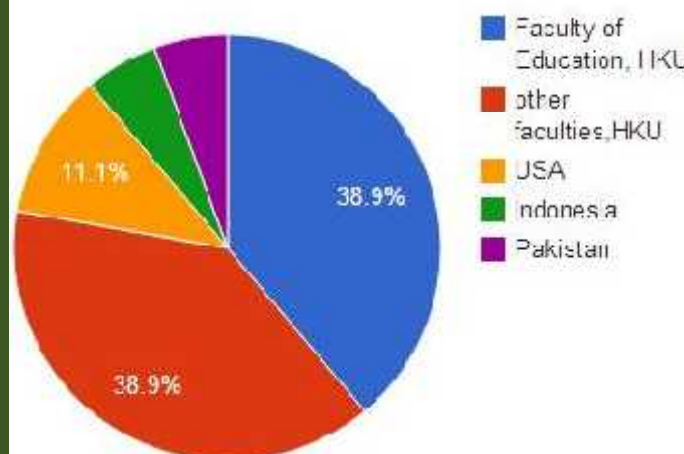
Review on the Summer Institute 2013

Summary of the Summer Institute 2013 Participants' Background



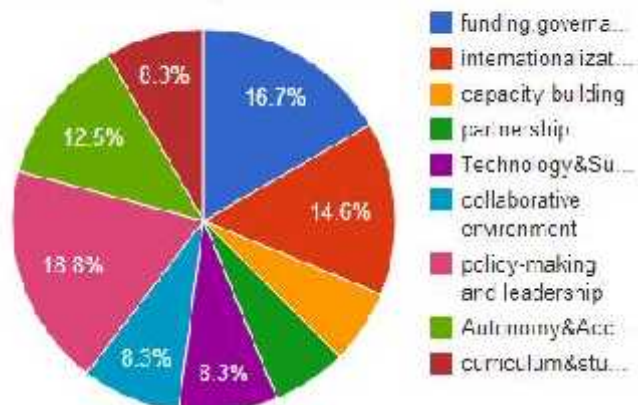
