### **Course Description**

## MEDD6441 Developmental Psychology for Educators

## Course description

This course will familiarise educators with the major theories, concepts and research findings of developmental psychology as well as some of the skills and techniques of gathering information on children and adolescents. The application of developmental research to educational practice and policy will also be considered. By the end of this course, students should gain an understanding of (1) major developmental theories, (2) the sequence of child and adolescent development and the processes that underlie them, (3) the interdependence of all aspects of development, i.e. physical, cognitive, emotional and social, and (4) the impact of context and culture on development.
